# **Expected Results and Sustainability of Projects Discussed at the Seminar in Gulbene**

The third as well the last two days seminar on final reporting and project closure issues took place in **Gulbene, Latvia on 9-10 April, 2014**. Event gathered about **70 project implementers** from Estonia, Latvia and Russia representing Beneficiaries and Partners of **15 projects** within the Programme. Presentations by JTS covered thematic issues related to finalization of supported Projects. Questions raised by participants touched the topics related to achieved indicators, possible extension of the project, calculation of balance payment, eligibility of costs of human resources, on-spot visits and use of savings. Teambuilding was examined in creative exercises, as well in discussions on joint opinion how the project sustainability will be ensured.

At the same time the event in Gulbene has closed the series of numerous seminars organised by the Programme for supported Projects during the current programming period.

#### **Developments in Preparation Process of Latvia-Russia CBC Programme**

To proceed with the preparation of Latvia-Russia CBC Programme 2014-2020 the 4<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Joint Programming Committee (JPC) was held on 24-25 April, 2014 in Mežotne Castle, Latvia. The major topics discussed were related to **large infrastructure projects**, **key thematic objectives**, forecast on **financial allocations** and **implementation provisions** for the future Programme. Next meeting of JPC is planned to take place in the middle of September 2014 in St.Petersburg, Russia.

#### **Programme Information Presented in Three Publications**

**Brochure "Project's Notebook"** gathering the information about supported **projects within 2<sup>nd</sup> Call** for proposals and **Programme leaflet** reflecting the **general information and statistical data** about the Programme and supported projects was issued in April. Information in both publications is available in four Programme languages and those will be distributed during the Programme events as well will be available in the offices of Joint Technical Secretariat.

**Special Fact Sheet** – **children focused, informative and colourful** is reflecting thematic capitalisation of Programme's support to children. In 24 projects out of 50 supported by the Programme children are the main or one of the target groups.

It was launched on 29 April in Ludza, Latvia by **Project "Tour de Latgale and Pskov"**. New app allows with your tablet PC to see exterior and interior appearance of Ludza Livonian Order castle, learn many facts about the time of the castle's history and everyday life. This is the first of its kind mobile application in the Baltic States, which is based on a virtual augmented reality technology.
