ELRI-191 outputs and results

Outputs

- **17 rescue excavations** and great number of **field inventories** carried out
- **4 digital archaeological databases** common for Estonia, Latvia, Russia produced
- 6 tourist routes in Estonia, Latvia and Russia (2 in each country) created
- **1 Viking Age farmstead** in Rõuge, Estonia created/ reconstructed
- **3 mobile exhibitions** in Pskov, **1 new exhibition** in Aluksne Museum and **3 new workshops** in Ludza Museum elaborated
- 7 books, 22 booklets, 31 leaflets, 19 brochures, 6 Newsletters issued and 8 educational films about archaeology prepared
- 3 editions of popular journal of archaeological science "Tutulus" issued

Around **150 public information days, schoolings, workshops** organised in Estonia, Latvia and Russia

Conservation laboratory in Pskov, Russia reconstructed

Around 2300 archaeological sites inspected or found in Estonia, Latvia and Russia

- 1 new CBC organisation between Estonia, Latvia and Russia "Archaeological Heritage Protection Network" established
- 1 project website created

RESULTS

A big amount of **new archaeological information harvested**, **recovered and preserved** for future studies

Archaeological and common cultural heritage preserved for next generations

Awareness of people of border areas risen about archaeological heritage and preservation of archaeological heritage

Systemised information available in databases on archaeological finds for Estonia, Latvia, Russia

Storage and assessment facilities of archaeological finds improved in Riga (Latvia) and Pskov (Russia)

Awareness of employees of local municipalities of Estonia, Latvia and Russia raised in terms of heritage protection

Cross border cooperation contacts between people, organisations in field of archaeology established and strengthened

Different **organisations ensure the cooperation plans** for future
